

Immunization/Vaccination Records

State Mandated Immunization Records: Records are due no later than the first day of classes. All students, regardless of status (part time, full time, international, etc.) must submit the mandatory immunization records. Please maintain a copy of your immunizations for your records.

COVID Vaccination Card: If you are uploading your COVID Vaccination Card, please ensure the entire card, including name, birthdate, and date(s) of dose(s) is visible on the card. The filename for your vaccination card should include your first and last name and "COVID Vaccination".

How to submit your vaccination cards/records through SONIS (Preferred method):

- 1. Log into your Eureka College SONIS Account using the username and password provided to you.
- 2. On the left-hand side, choose the "Biographic" page.
- 3. Next to your name, you'll see a paperclip. Click that and follow the instructions to upload your immunization records to your account. Be sure your file name includes your first and last name as well as "immunizations".

Other ways to submit your state-mandated immunization records:

- 1. Bring a hard copy of all records to the Office of Student Life, in the Cerf Center.
- 2. Mail your records to the College using the following address:

- 3. Submit records electronically one of two ways:

Please note: While you **may** use the form attached to the last page of this document, it is not required. You may submit immunization records in any form your physician provides.

Failure to meet this requirement will result in a fine and a hold on a student's records which will affect the ability to register for classes.

Immunization Information

In order to register for classes at Eureka College, the Immunization form or the certificate of Child Health examination from the student's high school or Public Department of Health, must be completed and in the possession of the Office of Student Life. A student cannot attend classes or participate in or practice for intercollegiate or intramural competition unless this record is on file in the Office of Student Life.

Because of Illinois State Department of Health requirements, it is important that these instructions be closely followed.

The Immunization Form attached may be utilized and is to be completed by a physician (or health care professional licensed to provide immunization verification).

It is not necessary for students born before January 1, 1957 to demonstrate immunity.

Diphtheria, Tetanus, Pertussis (DPT, DT, or Td vaccine): Students shall provide dates of any combination of three or more doses of Diphtheria, Tetanus, and Pertussis containing vaccine. One dose must be Tdap vaccine. The last dose of vaccine (DTP, DTap, DT, td, or Tdap) must have been received within 10 years prior to the term of current enrollment. Receipt of Tetanus Toxoid (T.T.) vaccine is not acceptable in fulfilling this requirement.

Measles: Students shall provide documentation of receipt of two doses of live measles virus vaccine on or after the first birthday. The minimum time interval between each dose must have been at least four weeks (28 days). If either does was received prior to 1968, proof must be provided that a live virus vaccine, without gamma globulin, was administered. Students who cannot provide proof of immunization may provide laboratory (serologic) evidence of measles immunity.

Rubella: Students shall provide documentation of receipt of two doses of live rubella virus vaccine on or after the first birthday. The minimum time interval between each dose must have been at least four weeks (28 days). Students who cannot provide proof of immunization may provide laboratory (serologic) evidence of rubella immunity.

Mumps: Students shall provide documentation of receipt of two doses of live mumps virus vaccine on or after the first birthday. The minimum time interval between each dose must have been at least four weeks (28 days). Students who cannot provide proof of immunization may provide laboratory (serologic) evidence of mumps immunity.

Meningococcal vaccine: Beginning Fall term 2016-2017, all new admissions under the age of 22 shall show proof of having at least one does of meningococcal conjugate vaccine on or after 16 years of age.

TB Skin Test: Required of all international students. Test must be within six months prior to entrance into Eureka College.
